A letter from Liz

Alleluia! The Lord is risen! He is risen indeed!
Alleluia!

What joy it was to celebrate Easter this year when so many people came to worship at our two churches. I want to thank everyone who came - because each one who joins together in worship contributes their offering of praise to our gracious Lord. It is so important that you are there in church!



We started with the Maundy Thursday service, which was special to a number of people. Then after the Walk of Witness on a beautiful warm Good Friday, we came into church for a very moving Meditation service led by Thia which took us through the events of the Passion and the Seven Words from the Cross. I would like to thank Thia so much for bringing us this presentation. Then on Easter Day we celebrated with two services at Middlewich and one at Byley. Joyfully we sang the Lord's praises in two very

different styles at Middlewich – the Choir led us at the 9.15 Sung Eucharist, and then we enjoyed the exuberance of the Festival Choir at our All-Age Communion at 11. Again my thanks to Jeremy, Christine and all our musicians of all traditions in both churches. There were 80 communicants at each of the Middlewich services and 42 at Byley – faith in our risen Lord Jesus is alive and well in our parishes!

Special Events

The life of our two churches is going to change dramatically within the course of one month! First we have the Byley Rose Fete on June 11th, always a joyful occasion when we celebrate the church and village community of Byley. Do come!

Then on Saturday 18th June at 5.00 pm many of us will be going to Chester Cathedral to join in that very special service of Ordination of Priests, where Thia (and Gill Stanning) will be ordained. Do pray for Thia as she takes this momentous step in her ministry. Then on Sunday morning, 19th, at 9.15 Thia will celebrate Communion for the first time – so do come and support her then, and pray for her.

But, of course, this is all taking place on Folk and Boat weekend – so we will then have a Festival Praise service at 11 am. This year there is no Big Top, so each church is doing something special to reach out to those gathered in the town. There will be an art exhibition in St. Michael's this year as a change from flowers – and food served all weekend in No 28, with puppets and other events taking place outside. Do help if you can.

Then on Sunday June 24th the only change is that we will have Communion at 11 am instead of Morning Praise – due to missing it next week.

July – Simon Drew begins his ministry!

On Friday, July 1st at 7.30 Simon will be Collated and Instituted into the Benefice of Middlewich and Byley by Bishop Peter and the Archdeacon at St. Michael's Church. There will be visiting Clergy and Readers as well as Civic leaders coming to welcome Simon and his family – as well as all of us!

Then on Sunday 3rd we are back at the Cathedral! Simon will be joining the service of Ordination of Deacons at 10am, when our own Lorraine Reed will be made Deacon. This means there will be NO 8am service that day (postponed to next week) and NO 11 am service. There will be a service of Morning Prayer taken by Steve Broadfoot at 9.15 for those who are not able

to go to the cathedral, then Steve will go to Byley at 11.

In the afternoon we will have a service for all the family from both churches to welcome Simon – a service which he will organise, and at which he will speak. This will be followed by tea!

So that means that Simon's first 'normal' Sunday will be July 10th. He will take the monthly 8am (postponed from last week), then celebrate and preach at 9.15, and preach at 11. In the evening at 7pm there will be a service of Evensong at Byley – followed by more tea!

So do pray for Simon, Thia and Lorraine as they begin new ministries among us – it will totally transform our ministry team! I think we can all recognise that God is at work among us – he is building his church here in these parishes, and inviting us to be confident in our calling and mission.

So let us rejoice in the victory of the cross and of the resurrection – let us look for the future to our risen Saviour in faith, hope and love.

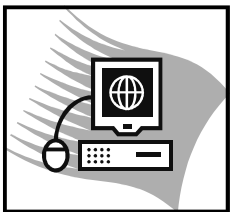

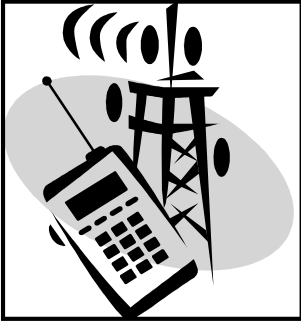
St Michael's Financial Position

You will recall that we have undertaken to keep you up to date with the financial position of St Michael's.

We are now just over a third of the way through the financial year. The budget was based on breaking even at the end of the year – no surplus, no deficit, and we are certainly doing better than we were at the same time last year thanks to many people increasing their giving, and economies being made. Of the people who pledged in October to make changes to their giving, about two thirds have now done so, so here is a gentle plea to those of you who have yet to act to do so before long. We are currently forecasting a deficit at the year end of about £5,000: it would be a good welcome to our new Rector to deliver a deficit free result in 2011. Keep up the good work!

Mobile Phone Base Station



You may be interested to know that St Michael's have been approached by a company acting for Vodafone and O2 with a view to installing a mobile phone base station in the Church tower which would provide a '3G' service from both companies to the local area.

The proposal is that aerials are installed behind new but identical louvres in the bell chamber, and that the electronic equipment would be installed in the clock chamber. The external appearance of the tower and the building would be unchanged. In return for a licence to occupy, the church would receive a rental payment every year for 20 years, and some improvements would be made to lighting and bird control in the tower.

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) decided at its meeting in March that we should explore the proposal in more detail, and make a decision later in the year based on the results of our investigations. Should the PCC decide to proceed, the installation would then require permission (a 'Faculty') from the Diocese of Chester, advised by the Church Architect, in common with all other changes to the Church fabric.

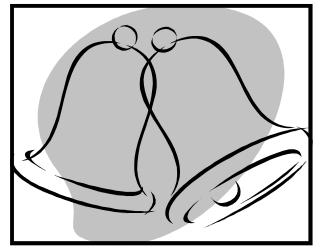

The Bells of St Michael's



2011 is an important year for three of the bells of Middlewich Church; it will be their 300th Birthday.

Before 1711 there were only four bells in the tower. It was decided to increase the number of bells to six. The original four were melted down and new tin and copper were added and a brand new peal of bells was cast by Abraham Ruddell of Gloucester. These new bells were hung in a new wooden frame.

The bells were taken down from the tower in 1897. The six bells were sent to Taylors of Loughborough. The first and fourth bells were recast, the remaining four were returned, one of which had been recast previously. Two new bells were added, a new treble and tenor. The bells were rehung in a new metal frame which had replaced the old wooden frame. These eight bells were rung for the first time for the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Victoria.

Many old bells have inscriptions on them commemorating special events or who donated them, nowadays they might have on who cast or recast them. The three bells celebrating their birthdays this year have inscriptions on them. The old second bell (which is now the third) has "let all the people say Amen 1711". The old fifth (which is now the sixth) has "to all our benefactors 1711". The old sixth (tenor) is now the seventh and has "T Warburton, W Wrench, I Hocknall, I Love CH Wardens 1711".

For 300 years these bells have been ringing for Sunday services, weddings, funerals and many special occasions. We hope to arrange some special ringing for their birthday and for them to be ringing for many more years.

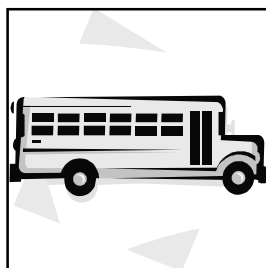

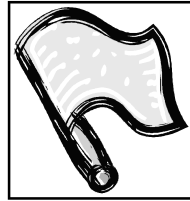

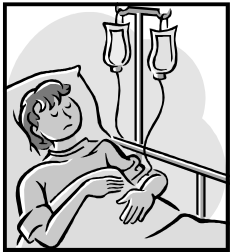

We need a lot of people for this event; please consider helping even if it is only for an hour!

“Is any one of you sick?”

I wonder if you think of the Bible as containing really practical, down to earth advice? The letter of James is certainly that. Let’s look at a some verses from this book.

What do we do when illness strikes? Well, of course we book an appointment with the doctor. But as Christians, there is more to it than that. If we go into hospital, we expect the Church to take an interest and visit – but that is where James’ letter comes in. Often people say, “I was in hospital and the Church never visited.” Sometimes this may mean that lots of people from the church have been – but none of the clergy!



But often no-one has bothered to tell us! We have three pastoral workers as well as the clergy, and it is amazing how often we come back from Leighton only to discover that someone else from the parish was in there, and we never knew!

So what does James tell us to do? (James 5:13-16) “If anyone of you in trouble? He should pray. Is anyone happy? Let him sing songs of praise. Is anyone of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up. If he has sinned, he will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed, The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective.”

We are probably quite at ease with the idea that if we are in trouble we should pray, and if happy, sing songs of praise. But what I really want us to realise is that it is not the role of the church to know when someone is ill – we are not psychic – that is totally forbidden! (See Deut. 18:10-13) It is up to the sick person and/or their family to send for the church – to ask for healing prayer, for the elders, that means the clergy and others of the leadership team, to come and pray and anoint. And that can be hard for us to do – for often it means putting our life in order, admitting all is not well, making ourselves vulnerable, and opening up our lives to God. But that is what the Bible teaches – and that is what we would like people to understand. We need to ask for prayer when we are ill, because the very act of asking opens our souls to the Holy Spirit and begins the work of healing.

And there is another opportunity to ask for prayer – on Tuesday mornings we have our healing service. This is a time for us to pray for those who are sick, and to receive prayer if we so wish. But again – you have to come forward to the communion rail – that very short journey opens our hearts to the Lord! So it would be great, if you have never been to that service, and you would like prayer for yourself or another, come along at 9.30 on a Tuesday morning. If you are unsure, do ask me for more information.

But the message is, that you are called to acknowledge that you need the ministry of the Church as well as the skills of the medical profession. You don't expect the doctor to know when you need his help – you make an appointment. So, if you are sick, please, **please** remember that it is up to you to let us know and to ask for prayer!

Palm Sunday in Cumbria

We had to attend our nephew's eighteenth birthday bash on Saturday 16th April, and were devastated to be missing Palm Sunday in Middlewich. As we could not possibly cope with a whole year without our palm crosses, we went to church in the parish of Alston Moor, hoping they would take pity on us.

The parish has six small churches, looked after by the Revd. Canon Judy Glover. Palm Sunday service for the whole parish was at the tiny church of the Holy Paraclete (it means comforter, from the Greek, and is a term for the Holy Ghost!) in a place called Kirkhaugh. This seemed to be a collection of isolated farms. The church was reached down a windy single-track road with cattle grids. It had a tall, thin spire and nestled among its gravestones in the valley.

The service started by the cattle grid at the top of the hill, where we were issued with tiny palm crosses and a few symbolic palm fronds. Judy had just returned from a pilgrimage to the Holy Land and was able to tell us what would be happening in Jerusalem on that day, when hundreds of people would arrive by coach and walk behind a donkey from Bethany to the Garden of Gethsemane (where some of the olive trees could have seen Jesus!).

We had a reading and a prayer and then processed to the church itself. The hymn books were amazing! At least a hundred years old, and very well used. The whole passion story was read as part of the service, with the Book of Common Prayer Communion taking over half way through.

It was a very special service (especially as it wasn't raining), and we promised to attend again next time family duties called.

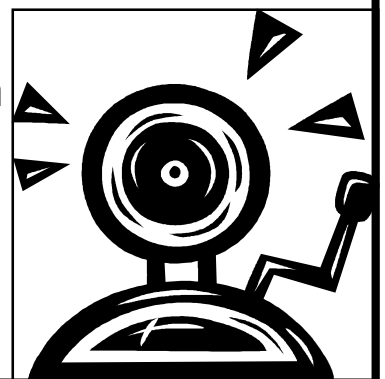

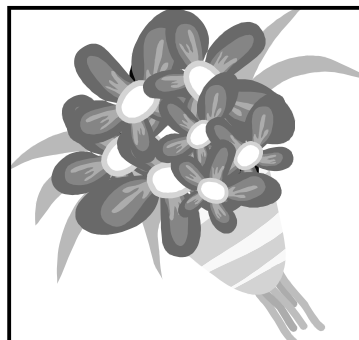
