A letter from Liz

So what I want to do is to echo St. Paul and express my thanks. The first people I want to thank are our parish representatives, Linda and Mike from Middlewich and Bruce and Glenys from Byley, who produced the most splendid parish profile, which in turn provided some very high quality applications for the post of Rector. The arrangements for the interviews were most professional, and we are so glad that at the end of the interview process they were able to make an appointment. We are all looking forward to the announcement of the identity of our new Rector, which will happen as soon as circumstances permit.



But where would we be without our churchwardens? I don't know whether you realise just how much work they have during an interregnum, so we would all like to offer our heartfelt thanks to Linda, Steve, Fiona, Bruce and Alan.

To go back to St. Paul – he is confident that the Lord, who began a good work in the Philippians will carry it on to completion. As Christians we start at the beginning with conversion, which may be sudden, or gradual if we are brought up in a Christian home and have never known a time when we did not know the love of the Lord Jesus. But then we are called to be sanctified, which means to be made holy, by growing in grace and the knowledge and experience of God. My prayer is that we will all grow during these months by our prayer and by studying God's word in the Bible daily, so that every day we receive, as it were, a letter from God. By the time you read this it will be nearly

Lent, a great time to take a book of the Bible and really study it. Why not try Luke's gospel, followed by the exciting sequel, the book of Acts?

So my prayer for you all is that you will know the love of the Lord Jesus sustaining and upholding you, and that we will all experience that growth in grace and fellowship mentioned by Luke in Acts 2:42, when he describes the early church thus: "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer." May you know the Lord's rich blessing as you grow in Him.

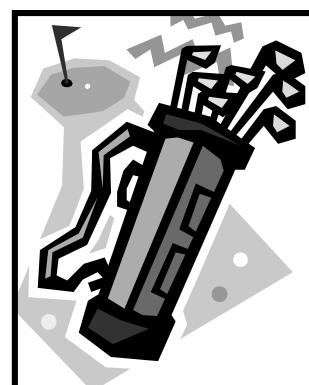

Claire Henry and the Children of Mpophomeni

Following their AGM in February, *the Mothers' Union* were pleased to welcome Claire Henry (back in Middlewich for THE WEDDING) to tell us a bit about her work in South Africa.

Claire told us that she is 1 year into a 3 year mission trip to Kwa-Zulu Natal, South Africa as a volunteer with a charity called Ethembeni, which seeks to provide for the holistic needs of families affected by HIV/AIDS in the township of Mpophomeni. The township has a population of around 40,000 people, 80% of which are unemployed and 1/3 infected with HIV/AIDS. Her role is mostly at Mpophomeni Family Centre, looking after 70 orphans and vulnerable children, making sure they get at least 1 good meal a day, teaching them, particularly English and computer skills and teaching Pre-School as well.

Claire also runs creative arts therapy sessions, aiming to help older children deal with issues going on in their lives through various creative arts such as poetry, painting and drama. As well as all these duties she plans for and manages all the charity's overseas volunteers.

It sounds to me as if she is really busy and doing a good job out there so we were really pleased to see her and wish her a safe journey back.

Christmas card Charity Board 2010

Last Christmas donations were sent to the Mission Aviation Fellowship. The following letter was received in reply:

We are so thankful for your kind gift of £100 which the church of St. Michael and All Angels raised by the Christmas card charity board. As we seek to help more people over the coming year, your prayers and support are greatly appreciated by us all.

We have some wonderful news to share with you from Tanzania and Arnhem Land.

After 5.5 hours hard driving from Dodoma Vehicle Workshop, Manager Glenn Cousley, the Bishop of Mpwapwa and avionics engineer Martin Ekholm arrived at Galigali, a village situated high on a plateau in Tanzania. The purpose was to see if it would be possible to build an airstrip near the village. The Bishop showed them the foundations of a new dispensary, and is very enthusiastic to bring the Good News and medical aid to the community. Since the village is so remote, the airstrip would be a vital lifeline and an alternative to the difficult drive from Dodoma. Please pray that we can help the villagers to build an airstrip, that this long process will run smoothly, and that partners will be found to provide both medical and evangelistic teams.

Praise God for the moving of His Spirit in various communities throughout Arnhem Land, Northern Australia. On Elcho Island, many young people meet every evening to worship and praise God. Last year saw a number of people being baptised at the Yolnu community of Yirrkala. We have been flying two local evangelists, Gerard and Kevin, to 20 villages, taking the Christian Christmas message and presents for the children. They have also been showing a Christmas film. Pray that the message will take root in the lives of people in these communities, and that we can continue to enable outreach there throughout the year ahead.

We are so grateful for the part you play in the MAF family, and we wish you every blessing in 2011.

A REVIEW BY SIMON HAMILL- STEWART

I had had a long day and nearly didn't go to this service. I am so glad I did. It was, of course different. By the time I arrived so many people had come that chairs were being carried upstairs and hymn books brought over the road. The room was packed out.



We began with a hymn and then we had an “ice breaker”: a series of commentaries on news items introduced by Robert, Carl, and Jeremy. The content was mostly serious but treated in a gently humorous fashion: a professor's complaint about the “deliberate” confusion in the layout of IKEA stores, the unwillingness of men, as opposed to women, to admit debt, the need of a Pakistani convert to prove that he WAS a Christian, to avoid being sent back to Pakistan. And did you know that National Hugging Day was at the end of January? The presenters hugged each other to celebrate this fact, but we stayed stolidly in our seats!

Then Chris Jeffrey sang, “Father's Song” by Matt Redman, and we moved on to an interview with John Hughes, the Vicar (now) of Sandiway, and Thia's husband, about his life and spiritual journey. We had a time of prayer led by Liz, a reading of Psalm 139 commented on in a short address by Lorraine Reed, a quiet time of listening to music. Then we sang a hymn, and after the blessing we all went downstairs for a cup of tea and some cake.

There was a “buzz” about this service and the tea afterwards, but though it was different it was serious (most of the time!). Robert is to be congratulated for having the idea and carrying it through so well.

Of course the venture has only just started; it's an act of faith. Though many people came, it has to be more than just a meeting of the faithful; it is for other people to come to. So come, or come again, and perhaps bring a friend, and pray that this may be part of the outreach of Number 28.

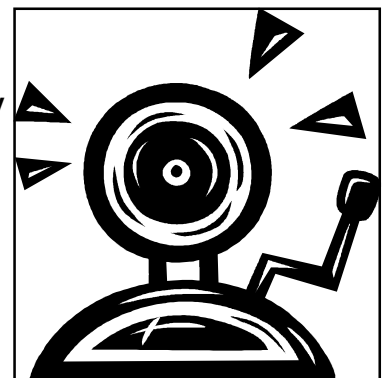
