LETTER FROM THE RECTOR:

Dear Friends...

Let me begin with some statistics. In a lifetime the average American will spend:

Six months sitting at stoplights

Eight months opening junk mail

One year looking for misplaced objects

Two years unsuccessfully returning phone calls

Four years doing housework

Five years waiting in queues

Six years eating.

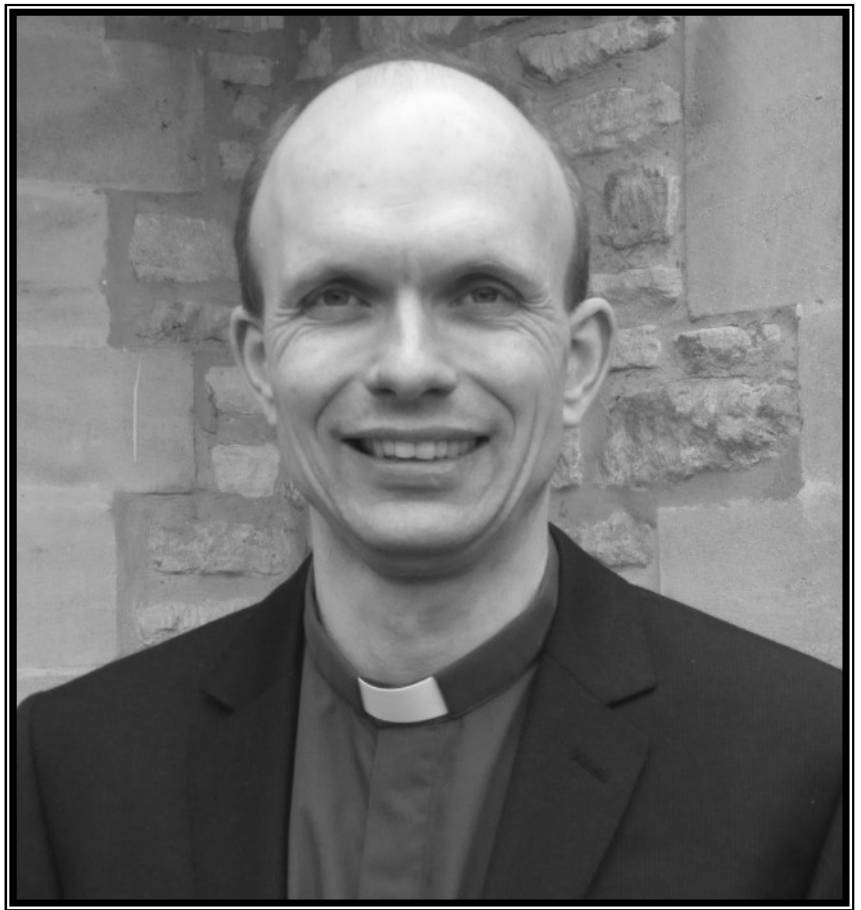
The question this makes me ask is – how long will they spend with God, and how long will they spend serving God?

As I write, our TVs, newspapers and web pages are full of images of rioting on the streets of our cities. I hope and pray that by the time you read this the events of the last few days will indeed be a past memory (albeit a bad one). The question everyone is asking of course is why? One obvious answer is that many people, especially young people, are disaffected. They have no job and maybe no hope of a job. They have time on their hands and nothing to do. Public & social services on the other-hand have too much to do, and not enough time to do it (whatever it may be). There is an imbalance of time that breeds frustration on both sides.

If you think time heals everything, try waiting in a doctor's surgery.

The OT book of Ecclesiasties (after Proverbs) has a well known passage that begins: *There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven* (3:1). This passage speaks of the balance of life and the need to give time to the important things of life. In the NT St Paul quotes Isaiah and then speaks of the immediacy of God's love and Salvation:

In the time of my favour I heard you, and in the day of salvation I helped you.



I tell you, now is the time of God's favour, now is the day of God's salvation.
(2 Corinthians 6:2)

In other words – don't put off the things of God. There is no time like the present to accept God's love, and no time like the present to serve God.

In many churches there is often an imbalance of time that breeds frustration. Many church members have time on their hands but are not asked to help and serve (is that you?). Church leaders on the other hand have too much to do, and not enough time to do it (whatever it may be).

Now is the time of God's favour, now is the day of God's salvation

Perhaps now is also the time for each and everyone of us to commit ourselves to God's service in a balanced way – so that no one is idle, and no one is worn out either.

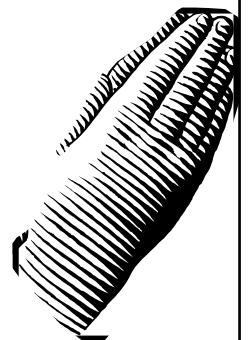

Finances at St Michael's

We promised to keep you up to date with our financial position, so here is a report at the end of the first six months of the year: it's a good story.

As reported in January, and as a result of increases in giving and savings in costs, the deficit at the end of 2010 at £9,400 was much better than forecast in October. The giving increases have continued through this year; new (cheaper) contracts have been negotiated for gas and electricity; we have made a good start on raising the profile of, and income to, the charities we support; and we may well meet our target to break even on the operating costs of Number 28. As a result, we are currently forecasting a deficit at the year end of about £3,000. Compared with the position at this time last year, this is a huge improvement, and thanks are due to those who have made it possible.

The PCC remains committed to running a balanced budget, where our routine income meets all our routine expenses. This is the only sustainable way to run a Church – or indeed a business or family, so please join with us in praying that we will be able to destroy the deficit this year and make it the first time for more than a decade that we break even.

On Tuesday 2nd August Jeremy Coles led a trip to the Soul Survivor youth festival at Stafford Show Ground. Five teenagers and five adults/leaders went from St Michael's. Although we only went for the day the event itself is a five-day festival and most groups camp for the entire week. We experienced some awesome worship and bible teaching both morning and evening in the midst of over 4,000 young people. We also had the opportunity to take part in some of the seminars during the afternoon. Some of us even had the privilege of getting involved in praying for those around us during the morning session when we saw many come to faith and others healed. The verdict from the five teenagers was – 'next year we're going to camp for the full five days'. So thank you Jeremy for organising this.

The dates for next years Soul Survivor festival are 27th-31st July 2012 (again at Stafford Show Ground). We do indeed plan to take a group of our young people for the full five days – camping of course. So if you are, or have, a young person who would like to come along put the dates in your diary. We will also need adult leaders. In particular we will need some helpers with experience of, and equipment for, catering for groups under canvas! If that is you and you would like an excuse to re-live your youth at a summer festival then please do speak to Jeremy Coles.

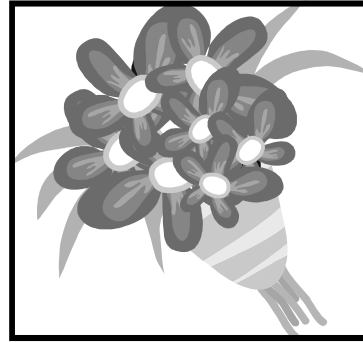

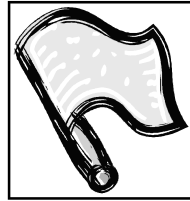

Leading chamber choir to perform at St Michael and All Angels Church

The Lydian singers, one of the leading chamber choirs in the North West, is to give a recital at St Michael and All Angels Church, on Saturday September 24th at 7.30pm. Based in Knutsford, the choir draws its membership from a far-surrounding area, including Warrington, Crewe, Nantwich, Staffordshire and Shropshire, and performs in a variety of venues throughout the North West and Midlands. The Lydian singers was founded in 1980 and under its conductor John Naylor, has developed a specialism for sacred music sung in liturgical settings, performing in many cathedrals both in the UK and overseas. However, the choir, numbering 25 or so singers, will be performing a lighter programme at St Michael's, which includes music by Bob Chilton, John Rutter, Haydn and English Tudor composers. Tickets cost £5 and are available from the church or choir members or, at the door. Proceeds will go to Christ for all in Andhra Pradesh.

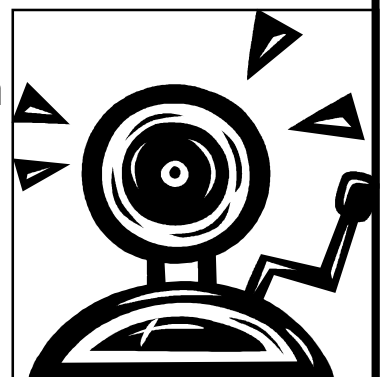

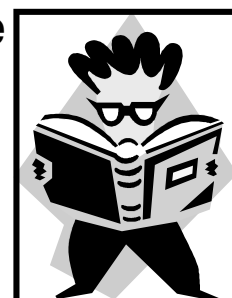
